

Creative and Performing Arts

Creative and Performing Arts (CPA) ECA include all the elements which can be found in an opera or musical – all the things which combine together to produce one magnificent total work of art. It can include: Singing, playing an instrument, fine art, sculpture, drama, theatre and stagecraft, dance, photography, film, animation, digital art, costumes and fashion design.

This is the ultimate group of creative ECA. In addition to this, many of our events and performances are outeach in the community or for charity, so there is a strong service element involved too.

CPA ECA are open to all students in all year groups. Because of the nature of the groups, they are often formed from mixed year groups according to experience level. For this reason, many activities take place on a Wednesday afternoon when students from all year groups are free to attend.

Music Composition Club

The club welcomes budding composers and songwriters from all year groups and provides support for exam composition coursework.
Students explore the fundamentals of composition techniques and digital music production while allowing for creative expression.

Talent Night

The feeling of performing alongside your friends in a professional theatre to a big audience is priceless. You also learn team-work, discipline and commitment, alongside developing performing skills. Choir

We work on good singing through a variety of musical styles. Extra care is taken of the boys' changing voices at this crucial stage in their development. This is a fun, high energy group with lots of public appearances throughout the year.

Senior / Community Choir

Senior Choir is an auditioned SATB group made up of students, parents, teachers and friends. We have performed in festivals and concerts at school, in Cyprus and internationally.

String Orchestra

The string orchestra achieves a good standard of playing since many students play string instruments from a young age. This is an auditioned group open to students from all year groups. Students receiving a school scholarship are required to attend.

Junior / Senior Band

Wind and Brass players join in rousing contemporary band music. Students receiving a school scholarship are required to attend.

.Jazz / Rock Band

A lively and friendly ensemble for beginner to intermediate guitar, bass, drums, wind and brass players. Join to develop your band skills, perform at school events and audition for festivals. The Junior Band performs regularly both at school and in the wider community.

Marching Band

Percussionists, drummers, wind and brass players get marching! Our aim is to participate alongside the school parade team.

Junior Drama

External Exams Support Lessons GCSE Art and Design

These lessons are designed specifically to help Year 4 and 5 students excel in their GCSE Art and Design preparatory studies. These sessions provide dedicated time for them to develop their skills, receive personalized feedback, and explore new techniques under the guidance of their experienced art teachers, visiting specialists, and artists. By participating in these support lessons, students will have access to additional resources and support as they progress through their coursework, ensuring they can realize and refine their ideas. This support will provide an invaluable opportunity to enhance their artistic journey and create outstanding work throughout the year.

Debate is a valuable activity for students of all skill levels, it teaches useful skills for other academic pursuits and life more generally. Speaking and Creative Writing for Juniors

Dynamic Speakers Club

The Dynamic Speakers Club aims to equip the students of year 2 & 3 with skills that help them build a strong foundation in the areas of Communication and Leadership. These skills are crucial for teenagers as they boost confidence, improve communication abilities, and enhance academic and career opportunities.

Through its interactive sessions, the club helps in developing confident speakers and presenters by working on 3 key aspects:

Overcome nervousness when speaking before an audience. Organize and present ideas logically and convincingly. Offer advice to help others improve without criticizing them.

At the end of the year, students will have the opportunity to deliver a speech or make a presentation on a topic of their choice in front of an audience at a speaking event.

The club acts as a strong foundation for mastering debating skills and will also empower the students to face real-life challenges like presenting ideas at Euromath or Junior Achievement or giving a speech during their senior years at Mock Trials, EYP and MUN. The communication techniques taught at the club will help them build a skill set that will come handy beyond their school years like handling interviews and pitching ideas in university and beyond.

Greek Debate Club

At the Greek Debate Club we accept enthusiastic lower school students who would like to voice their opinion on controversial and contentious issues, as well as to improve their debating skills and learn more about the art of speech. Raising awareness on several crucial national and international matters can be an important aspect of pupils' development, as it helps them expand their knowledge and their capacity to apply their critical thinking skills on a wide array of subjects. In this way a student is encouraged to think broadly, which is a defining characteristic of a global citizen.



Greek Creative Writing

Creative writing can technically be considered any original composition of any type of writing which serves primarily the need for keeping records of significant experience, the need for sharing experience with an interested group, and the need for free individual expression which contributes to mental and physical health. The aim of the Creative Writing Club is to allow the students to express their emotions and to help them to strengthen their skills and writing techniques. Creative writing is usually taught in a workshop and students submit original work for peer critique. Students also format a writing method through the process of writing and re-writing and they are given the opportunity to come in contact with the work of distinguished writers through a more creative way. This year's aim is to participate in competitions, to attend workshops by experts, to meet with authors and to celebrate the international day of poetry in March.

MFL for years 3-7

Spanish Club

Join our Spanish club for the official Spanish language exams of the Instituto Cervantes, tailored for students already studying Spanish at school, from Year 3 to Year 7. Led by a DELE qualified examiner, we prepare for DELE oral exams from A1 to C2 levels. Thursdays, after school. Enhance oral skills and writing tasks with DELE books and teacher-provided resources.

German Club

Join the German Club, designed for Year 3 to Year 7 students already studying German! We offer specialized preparation for the Goethe-Institut exams, from A1 to C2 levels. Our sessions focus on enhancing speaking and writing skills using official materials. Meet with us every Monday after school to improve your German and prepare for certification. Let's excel and take your German to the next level together!







Debate, Public Speaking and Creative Writing for Upper School

Senior English Debate Society

The Senior Debating Society at the English School has over the last 25 years or so made huge strides in promoting public speaking as a serious discipline both at the School and in Cyprus. We have taken part in the International Independent Schools Public Speaking Tournament since 1991 with great success. More recently, we participated in the High School Mock Trial Competition in Cyprus where our team won 1st place, with one of our students earning the 'Best Lawyer' award and an invitation to intern at one of the law firms sponsoring the event. At the Senior Debate Club, our students debate about current issues in front of a live audience, demonstrating their public speaking and teamwork skills through their persuasive speeches and debates with their opponents. Students can improve their critical thinking by challenging their opponents and objecting to their arguments. Members of Senior Debate club also have the opportunity to develop their impromptu speaking skills by planning and delivering speeches on a more independent level, which they particularly enjoy.

Year 6 & 7 Literature & Creative Writing Club

This is one of our newer clubs for our older students who are interested in enthusing together about Literature in English, and creating pieces of writing out of our discussions and activities. We explore themes that are often linked to the writing competitions and the school's magazine. We share and discuss our favourite authors, books and poems, and we often link our literary interests to the arts and media for more interconnected outcomes. We hold stimulating creative writing sessions and nourish a safe space for our trials and errors in such endeavours. Our aim for the year ahead is to share our discussions with the rest of our community in podcasts, and to support our team members to enter their creative writing pieces in more competitions and publications.

School Magazine and Journalism Club

Model United Nations

Thimun - MUN

The Hague Model United Nations is a club which has been running for a number of years and which has achieved a great deal of popularity among students from years 5-7. The MUN is a simulation of the real United Nations where every school is assigned a country to represent. Members of the school's delegation act as delegates of that country through lobbying, writing resolutions, learning about the United Nations and becoming well – versed in parliamentary procedure. extensive preparation students attend THIMUN a one-week conference which is held in The Hague, The Netherlands during the last week in January every year. Students are selected after an interview process, as the programme become highly competitive, meetings are held every Thursday between 1.45pm - 3.00pm and attendance is mandatory.

Medimun

As a conference accredited by THIMUN Foundation, the Mediterranean Model United Nations (MEDIMUN) holds a venerable status, duly recognized by the governing institution that endorses Model United Nations conferences globally. MEDIMUN was established in the year 2006 under the auspices of The English School and has since served as an educational platform of considerable repute. It enables young scholars to deepen their understanding not merely of specific nation-states, but also of the

intricate operations of the United Nations through immersive, experiential learning. Further amplifying its significance, MEDIMUN enjoys the distinction of being the most expansive and longest-running Model United Nations conference in Cyprus. Administered under the aegis of a non-profit organizational structure, the conference is orchestrated by a dedicated cadre of both student and educator volunteers. These individuals altruistically invest their time and intellectual resources to guarantee the event's continued success and scholarly impact.

MEDIMUN is a debating activity where students take on the role of diplomats from a country. They prepare resolutions on topics of current interest for the annual conference in February. At the conference, students are welcomed from across Cyprus and abroad and it is run by students of The English School. Weekly meetings are held to train students for their roles as delegates or organisers. Students are selected through competitive interview. This year, delegates will be from Years 4-7.

Science, Discovery and Innovation ECA Champion: KDE

Students of all ages learn more science-content and skills when they engage in investigation and discovery using everyday materials and the basic equipment of science. Introducing students to the fun of science through hands-on interactive experiments, adventures, and inquiry. Some Science ECA like Radio Club cross over into STEM, while others focus on GCSE and A level enrichment. The sky's the limit with our unique and exciting Astronomy Club!

The English School Astronomy Club

Open to all year groups, this club provides interesting activities and education in astronomy and related space sciences. We hold weekly meetings to plan events such as observation sessions, lectures, visits to scientific establishments, trips to dark sites and whole school events. We also discuss the universe, learn about telescopes, and enter competitions in conjunction with the Science Competitions club. Our members can also compete in international competitions, run by ESA and NASA. We also give presentations on various astronomical phenomena and space programs to the wider community.

There is something for everyone at the Astronomy Club and everyone is welcome.

BioBolt Year 5 (Monday) and Year 6 (Thursday)

BioBolt provides our year 5 and 6 biology students with the opportunity to practice and refine their skills outside of regular classroom hours through regular support and practice sessions with a focus on past paper questions. Students will be guided by our experienced teachers and will be provided with valuable insights into exam techniques. By working through additional past papers and practice questions, students will gain familiarity with the exam format and reinforce their understanding of key concepts.

ESBS (Biological Society)

The English School Biological Society encourages inquisitive learners who are passionate about biology through a blend of academic enrichment, practical experiences, and competitive opportunities. Competitions include the intermediate biology Olympiad, genius genetics competition and DNA-day essay competitions. Students in year 6 who are selected to complete an EPQ will be an integral part of the society.

Science Competitions Club

This club is dedicated to those students who enjoy investigating scientific concepts above and beyond the science syllabus. The aim is to use club time to plan, create and carry out experiments that will be presented to the public in national competitions. If you are looking for an opportunity to shine in science, come and try this club.



Medicine Club

The Medicine Club is a student lead club open to Year 5,6 and 7 students. It will consist of studentprepared presentations, guest speakers and discussions based on the application process for medicine in the UK and EU. Presentations will cover topics such as medical specialties: radiology, pulmonology, neurology, paediatrics, etc., research on medical advancements as well as the ethical concepts of medicine to include the four pillars of medical ethic: stem cell, euthanasia, mRNA technology controversy and clinical ethics. Similarly, invitations will be extended to doctors to speak to us about their specialty as well as their journey in medicine, some of which can be English School alumni. Students will have the opportunity to ask questions and discuss with guest speakers.

The club will also act as a guide for younger students who are interested in medicine. Through the club they will discover and enhance their passion for medicine, while gaining valuable information and knowledge that will assist them in writing their personal statement and completing medical school interviews. Since interviews are particularly important in medical school applications, practicing interview questions and covering topics that commonly come up in interviews will act as preparation for students.

Furthermore, younger students will be introduced to UCAT as it has become a vital aspect of medical school applications in both the UK and Greece. Year 7 students will guide younger students by providing tips and help on the admission test as well as help them effectively plan work experience which is a requirement from medical schools.

Economics Olympiad

The Economics Olympiad was first introduced on the 3rd of March 2019 by the "Pancyprian Association of Economics Teachers" and is funded by Deloitte. It is running parallel to the Accounting Olympiad, attracting a lot of attention and being warmly embraced by all schools, teachers and students around Cyprus. Last year's Economics Pancyprian Olympiad took place on the 8th of March, with two of our students being rewarded with the Silver Award. The aim of the club is to deepen the economic and financial literacy of high school students (A-level students), by preparing them to compete with other students on a similar educational level. The opportunity to compete against peers at a national level goes beyond being simply a support lesson and builds confidence and character.





Economics Society

The Economics Society Committee, which is elected annually, aims at informing the members of the Society, as well as the members of the School Committee about a variety of topics and issues related to the field of Economics, for example how markets work, factors affecting the behaviour and decision making of economic agents as well as the importance of policymaking for the operation of economies. Last school year, a number of events were organised by our Society, including collection of non-perishable food items to help the Caritas Charity Cyprus, and the Annual lecture sponsored by Hellas Direct, with guest speakers the ex-Finance Minister Mr Harris Georgiades and Mr Michalis Antoniou Product Manager of Hellas Direct, both graduates of The English School.

Volunteering and offering to others and society, but also trying to understand the fundamental ways through which economics shapes our lives will always be central to the aims and activities of the Economics Society, one of the most interesting and active societies our school offers to its students.

Chess Club

Chess Club is a place for students to play casually against one another. Chess club takes place bi-weekly on Thursdays and is open to Y4-7 students

Radio Club

The English School Radio Club is an amateur radio club. This involves On-Air communication with people all over the world as well as contests and awards. Many physics and electronic projects are also done by the students, such as building antennas and transceivers. The Radio Club serves as a meeting place for its members all through the year. It is a trademark of the school and forms part of the school's glorious history!

European Programmes

EYP, EPAS, MEP

Our peer-to-peer educational programme inspires and empowers young people from our school and across Europe to become open-minded, tolerant, and active citizens. We provide participants with a forum to develop and express their opinions on a wide range of topics. By bringing together young people from diverse backgrounds, we foster intercultural understanding and friendships across borders.

Participants and volunteers in the European Youth Parliament (EYP), European Parliament Ambassador School (EPAS), and Model European Parliament (MEP) are equipped with the knowledge and skills needed to positively shape the world around them. Thousands of young people are actively involved as volunteers all over Europe, making EYP, EPAS, and MEP genuinely youth-driven programmes – run by young people, for young people.



Erasmus+

The values of Erasmus are: unity in diversity, diversity in unity, students helping students, fun in friendship and respect, the international dimension of life, love for Europe as an area of peace and cultural exchange, openness with tolerance and cooperation in integration.

During weekly meetings, Year 2 students from The English School will collaborate with students from our 5 partner schools (Germany, Portugal, Poland, Italy, Finland) to explore the topic 'Food for Thought'. The project will involve various activities at the school as well as in the different partner countries. Students are encouraged to embrace the values of Erasmus and should be interested in travelling to other countries, be willing to be hosted by local families and to host in return.





Being involved in these ECA provide students with an opportunity to apply what they have learned, or employ skills that they may not easily get the chance to use in class. Leadership skills, collaboration, tackling a global issues, or experiencing the challenges of ethical choices are among the character developing outcomes within these activities. They should find things that are rewarding to them, and make their lives more interesting.

In addition to this, many Universities look for the "well rounded student." The learning outcomes in this program just happen to be the exact same thing universities would like to see in an applicant.

If you're passionate about environmental issues, stand for ECO Warrior in your form. Get involved and together we can make our school a greener place! Eco-Schools is a fundamental initiative which encourages young people to engage in their environment by allowing them the opportunity to actively protect it. It starts in the classroom where it expands to the school and eventually the community at large.

Through this programme, young people experience a sense of achievement at being able to have a say in the environmental management policies of our school, steering them towards certification and the prestige of the Green Flag award following a three-year Action Plan.

It combines learning with hands-on experiences, the whole programme is run according to an all-inclusive, participatory approach involving students, teachers and the local community at large.

Eco-Schools challenges students to engage in tackling environmental problems at a level where they can see tangible results, spurring them to realise that they really can make a difference.

Projects and actions are discussed and run by an environmental committee including both students and teachers.

CAS stands for Creativity, Activity and Service, and the CAS Project aims to make a genuine, sustainable impact through transformative cross-cultural experiences.

We recognise our responsibility as educators and seek to harness the power of experiential learning to inspire students while bringing long-term benefits to the communities and environments in which we operate.

How is this project CAS?

- •Creativity is interpreted broadly to include a wide range of arts activities as well as the creativity students demonstrate in designing and implementing service projects.
- •Action can include not only participation in individual and team sports but also taking part in expeditions and in local or international projects.
- •Service encompasses a host of community and social service activities. Some examples include helping children with special needs, visiting hospitals and working with refugees or homeless people.

The Physical Education Department is committed to providing a range of extra curricular activities for all year groups. In terms of ECA provision, the PE Department provides options for our top athletes in terms of School Teams, which train regularly and participate in competitions against other schools or clubs. 

STEM ECA Champion: STU

Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths-innovation, problem-solving, and critical thinking

F1 in Schools

F1 in Schools is an international STEM (science, technology, engineering, mathematics) competition for school children (years 3-7), in which groups of 3-6 students have to design and manufacture a miniature car out of the official F1 Model Block using CAD/CAM design tools. The cars are powered by CO2 cartridges and are attached to a track by a nylon wire. They are timed from the moment they are launched to when they pass the finish line by a laser beam which measures the speed up to 1000th of a second. The cars have to follow extensive regulations, in a similar fashion as Formula 1 (e.g. the wheels of the car must be a set diameter and width with zero tolerance). The cars are raced on a 20m long track with two lanes, to allow two cars to be raced simultaneously. Software called F1 Virtual Wind Tunnel was designed specifically for the challenge. F1 Virtual Wind Tunnel or F1 VWT uses computational fluid dynamics (CFD) to simulate air resistance on the "cars" made in the CAD. The competition is currently operational in over 42 countries and was first introduced in the UK in 1999. The competition's aim is to introduce younger people to engineering in a more fun environment. The competition is held annually, with National Finals usually in March- June of each year. The overall winners of the National Finals are invited to compete at the World Finals, which are held at a different location each year, usually held in conjunction with a Formula One Grand Prix.



FTC

The FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC) is a robotics competition for students in years 3-7 to compete head-to-head, by designing, building, and programming a robot to compete in an alliance format against other teams. It involves the robot performing certain challenges within a set time limit.

D&T Club

D&T Club gives the opportunity for students to explore, analyse, design and create using a variety of methods and techniques through mini activities and projects.

Robotics Club

The aim of the English School Robotics Club is to provide a safe, productive learning environment to students in 1st-7th form. Throughout the year students will learn about the fundamental principles of building and programming a robot all while working together to overcome challenges. The club will also encourage, train and support students wishing to attend Pancyprian or International competitions.

The Cyber Security club

The club was run by a Year 5 student, Evangelos Lioudakis, and was supervised by a teacher. The Cyber Security club's aim was to provide workshops and training sessions throughout the year. These sessions were designed to teach students the basics of cyber security, as well as more advanced topics such as reverse engineering and web application security. Members of the club enjoyed solving puzzles and challenges related to the different concepts being taught each time. These challenges ranged from binary exploitation to cryptography and coding.

Ritangle and Data Science Club Years 6 - 7

Ritangle is a free maths competition aimed at teams of sixth form/college students running over approximately 10 weeks in the Autumn term. It's made up of around 24 'first round' questions, released daily on weekdays, which unlock information necessary to solve the final multi-part question. The problems are released throughout October and daily during most of November and the start of December

The Data Science Exam evaluates students' expertise in data analysis, statistical modeling, machine learning, and data visualization. It encompasses practical problemsolving using programming languages like Python or R, emphasizing a comprehensive understanding of statistical concepts and data manipulation techniques. By successfully completing the course and its assessments, students are honoured with an MEI certificate.

The UCAT (University Clinical Aptitude Test) is a standardised computer-based assessment designed to assess students' ability to interpret numerical and written information presented in various formats. 
