## Read the following text from About Bees and Honey and answer the questions that follow.

The leaf-cutter bee, biting with her powerful jaws, will cut an oval shape from the edge of a rose leaf, roll it into a cylinder, and fly back to line her nest with it. She digs a tunnel in rotten wood to make her nest in - or finds a tunnel left by some other insect.

Mining bees nest in the ground. There are more than 100 different species and they are especially useful in pollinating fruit trees. The female will burrow as much as 600 mm into the ground. She digs with her front feet and her hind feet kick out the earth behind her.

The cuckoo bee is a solitary bee but it looks like a bumble bee. It behaves like the cuckoo bird, in the way it lays its eggs. The female has no pollen. She carries sacs on her legs and so is unable to feed and care for her young. Instead she will try moving into a bumble bee's nest. The workers will attack her at first, but if she manages to stay, they begin to accept her as queen.

There are sixteen species of bumble bee. They build up small colonies of up to a few hundred bees in the Spring after the queen has made a nest underground in an old mouse hole or similar hiding place.

Honey bees live in permanent and very much larger colonies of up to 60,000 bees. They have been valued for their honey ever since early man took honey from wild nests. Nowadays they usually live in wooden hives and are looked after by a bee-keeper.
