Read the following adapted article from The Times, 'Dog Owner in China Spends $€ 13,650$ on Drone Display for Pet's Birthday', and answer the questions that follow.

Police threaten to shoot down unauthorised celebration.


The drone display went against a no-fly zone law

A dog owner rented 520 drones to spell out the words "Happy $10^{\text {th }}$ Birthday to Doudou' and then form patterns of a birthday cake and gift box containing a bone.

The unusual treat cost $€ 13,650$ in China’s south-central Hunan province but irritated the local police because no permission had been given. Officers threatened to shoot down similar displays.

Videos showed the unnamed dog's owner and her friends - wearing Christmas hats - also singing 'happy birthday' to the animal, which didn't seem interested in what was going on.

The drones had been specially flown to form Chinese characters wishing the pet happy birthday above the Xiangjiang River in the city of Changsha.

However, the celebration was held close to several multi-storey apartment buildings in violation of the city's strict drone no-fly zones. Changsha police said that people should
apply for approval before flying drones in the area, before warning that officers would shoot down unapproved devices.

The South China Morning Post explained that the Mandarin pronunciation of 520 - the number of drones used - sounds like 'I love you’.

'I Love You' in Chinese Characters

In Britain pet owners have been known for spoiling their dogs by paying for them to stay at resorts, wolfing down quails' eggs and champagne.


Last year The Times reported on a special menu - although a cheaper one - on offer at an ultra dog-friendly pub The Stables in Krikintilloch, East Dunbartonshire, including chicken and sausages, as well as 'Bottom Sniffer', a gravy-flavoured dog beer.

Research by Rover.com, the dog walking service, in 2019 showed that Britons spent $€ 148$ million yearly to celebrate their dogs' birthdays. In China the media said that it was 'not unusual' for owners to spend 1200 euros on pet birthday parties.
